Introduction

Humber, Ford and Stoke Prior group parish council is undertaking a Neighbourhood development plan and has established a steering group to perform this task.

In order to inform the development plan, a number of consultations have taken place with residents of the group parish. These include delivering, in May 2014, a package comprising a cover letter, map, a questionnaire for each resident aged 16 and over, and a young people's questionnaire for all those aged 5 to 15. These were subsequently collected between late May and early June.

In addition, a number Young People's questionnaires were completed at some schools in the area.

The information from the young people's questionnaires returned has been collated and analysed. It is presented in this basic report which shows the views of all respondents and also just those who live within the group Parish.

This report has been independently produced by Data Orchard CIC¹, commissioned by the Humber, Ford and Stoke Prior Group Parish Council, and is based directly on the residents' responses to the distributed questionnaires.

Presentation of results

This report is comprised tables and charts presenting the results of the survey and responses to the open text questions which have been included as lists in this report.

The base used for calculating the results as percentages is the total number of respondents who answered the particular question.

The tables show the number and percentage of respondents who selected each option. When percentages are presented, they are rounded to the nearest whole number.

Survey methodology

The steering group developed three questionnaires:

- A residents' questionnaire for those aged 16 and over
- A young people's questionnaire
- A questionnaire for owners to identify potential land for development

The residents' questionnaire included a map of the group parish which residents were asked to mark and return with their questionnaire in response to a series of questions about housing development.

The cover letter and questionnaires described the context and purpose, the return instructions, and provided information on where to get help if required.

The Group Parish was divided into 25 areas and a volunteer distributor and collector assigned to each. A list was compiled of all properties in each of these areas, making 279 in total of which 9 were unoccupied.

In early May 2014, a package was delivered to each household which comprised:

- A cover letter
- A questionnaire and map for each resident aged 16 years and over
- A questionnaire for each young person aged 5 to 15 years
- A single land for development questionnaire
- A return envelope for the residents' and young people's questionnaires
- A separate return envelope for the land for development questionnaires.

The packages were subsequently collected by the volunteers between late May and early June.

In addition a number of schools provide an opportunity for young people to complete the questionnaires at school and passed on the completed returns to the steering group.

All the detailed information is treated confidentially.

A copy of the survey questionnaire can be found in Appendix 1.

Results

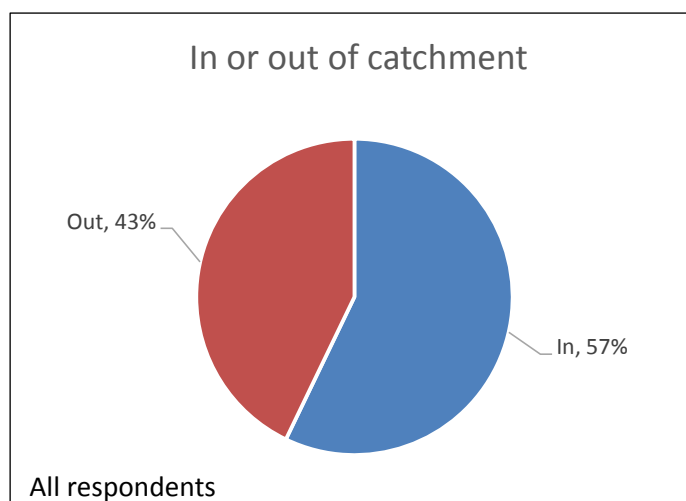
Response to the survey

According to the 2011 Census, the total number of people aged 5 to 15, usually resident in the parishes of Humber plus Ford and Stoke Prior on 27th March 2011 was 73². However, this figure includes the Newton area which is not part of the Group Parish. There are no published census figures which provide a population estimate for Newton alone, or for Humber, Ford and Stoke Prior excluding Newton. It is thought that the number of 5 to 15 year old residents of Newton is around 4 and using this figure provides an estimated population of the group parish of Humber, Ford and Stoke Prior of approximately 69.

A total of 126 at least partially completed questionnaires were returned of which 72 were believed to be from young people within the Group Parish, including one from a 16 year old. Clearly this slightly exceeds the estimated population of this group, but it would suggest that there are responses from all or a high proportion of Young People in the group parish.
